

LIBROS PARA PUEBLOS ANNUAL CONFERENCE 2015

Libros para Pueblos, a nonprofit, will hold its annual training conference on Saturday February 28 at the Oaxaca Central Library for library managers, Regional Coordinators and volunteers who work in more than 70 libraries in different regions of the state.

This conference brings together more than 150 reading professionals and community members who have been called together by the organization to provide them with tools to empower them to provide the benefits of reading to the children, young people and adults in Oaxaca.

The program starts at 8:30 am with registration of participants, followed by some presentations, a Puppet Workshop and a talk named "reading with music".

The afternoon will include several round tables for participants share successful practices, experiences, challenges and creative solutions with librarians from other communities.

During the event, Libros para Pueblos will present its new Executive Director, Judith Marcial Calderon, who has replaced Eliz Olivella. At the end of the event, this year's books, for children and young people, from Mexican and foreign publishers, more than 5000 in total, will be delivered to the library representatives.

Libros para Pueblos is a nonprofit organization founded in 1998 and incorporated legally, whose mission is to partner with communities in Oaxaca, Mexico to establish lending libraries for children, provide free access to books and technology, and develop advocates for the joy and discovery of reading. Currently supports more than 70 libraries with packages of books and training. The organization is made up of an Executive Committee, one Executive Director, 8 Regional Coordinators and dozens of volunteers who make its work possible.
